The Northwest Missouri Regional Council of Governments (RCOG) is hosting the first gathering in a series of meetings focusing on the 5-year update for Nodaway County's Multi-jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan. The Kickoff meeting will be held Wednesday, March 1, at 4 p.m., at the Maryville Public Safety Building, located at 101 N. Vine, Maryville. All interested citizens and public officials of Nodaway County are invited to attend. Nodaway County is susceptible to many types of natural hazards. Tornadoes, winter storms, and flooding have shaped the landscape, history, and economy of the county. Hazard mitigation planning is the process of developing sustained actions to reduce or eliminate the long-term risks associated with these potential disasters. The plan, funded by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the communities of Nodaway County, will utilize a committee of first responders, elected officials, and public volunteers to gather community- and county-specific information. The Hazard Mitigation Plan, currently under revision by the County and RCOG, is a requirement to access federal mitigation funds in the event of a natural disaster. The Committee will discuss existing hazards, community profiles, and the general plan update process as well as reviewing the Risk Assessment. # Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection March 4

The Nodaway County Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Site will be open Saturday, March 4, 2023, from 8:00 A.M. to 12 noon. The HHW Collection Site is located at the Nodaway County Maintenance Barn, 1516 East Halsey Street, Maryville, Missouri. Brochures are available at the Nodaway County Administration Building, the Regional Council office, or online at <a href="www.nwmorcog.org">www.nwmorcog.org</a>. Residents of Atchison, Gentry, Holt, Nodaway, and Worth Counties are welcome to participate (ID required). There is no fee to drop-off. It is FREE for residents only. No commercial or business waste can be accepted. Examples of HHW include household chemicals (bleach, ammonia, and cleaners) fertilizers, pesticides, brake fluid, transmission fluid, household waxes, Ni-cad, lithium, and lead acid batteries, compact fluorescent light bulbs, florescent tubes, antifreeze, oil base paint, and varnish. No latex paint accepted. Latex paint can be dried and put into the trash. Directions provided upon request. Keep materials in the original container. Do not mix household hazardous wastes together. 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#### Holt County U.S. Route 159 pavement improvement project resumes

A pavement improvement and flood remediation project on Holt County U.S. Route 159 is expected to resume Monday, Feb. 27. The Missouri Department of Transportation has contracted with Phillips Hardy, Inc., to complete the project. Crews began the project in May 2022 before pausing due to winter weather. As a flood remediation measure, erosion control is being installed from the Missouri River near Rulo, Nebraska, to the Little Tarkio Creek near Fortescue. During construction, temporary traffic signals will be in place to guide motorists through the one-lane work zone, starting east of Del Rio Road going west in approximately 1-mile sections. All work is expected to be completed in November 2023. This project also includes pavement improvements from Missouri Route 111 one mile west of Route 118 to Route 118 which is planned to begin in July. All work is weather-permitting, and schedules are subject to change.

#### E-Waste Collection Held February 18 next Collection Set for March 18

The second of five E-Waste and White Goods Collections was held on Saturday, February 18 in the communities of Rock Port, Fairfax, Tarkio, and Burlington Junction. Approximately 700 pounds of goods were collected and hauled by the contractor, Nodaway County Recycling, Maryville, MO for proper disposal. The next E-Waste/White Goods collection is schedule for Saturday, March 18 in King City, Stanberry, and Jefferson School District. The collection is open to all residents in Atchison, Gentry, Holt, Nodaway, and Worth Counties are welcome to participate (ID required). ## Atchison County I-29 traffic to move head-to-head

#### Joint repair planned for northbound Nishnabotna River bridge

The northbound bridge over the Nishnabotna River will close Wednesday, March 6, for a joint repair. Crews from Phillips Hardy, Inc., working with the Missouri Department of Transportation, are completing the repair following a rehabilitation project of the north and southbound bridges located just south of the lowa state line. During the northbound bridge closure, crossovers will be utilized to direct traffic head-to-head in the southbound lanes of Interstate 29 at the bridges. A 15-foot width restriction will be in place for northbound traffic. The joint repair is expected to be completed in early May. This bridge, along with the southbound bridge, is included in Gov. Mike Parson's \$351 million Focus on Bridges program, which will repair or replace 250 bridges across the state. All work is weather-permitting, and schedules are subject to change.
