#2 - Milk jugs, butter tubs, yogurt container, cleaning product bottles



Aluminum cans, tin cans, metal containers

- No food or liquid
- Please rinse well



Glass bottles and jars

- No food or liquid
- Please rinse

Ceramics, kitchen cookware/glassware

- Mirrors, window panes, dishes and light bulbs.
- These items cannot be recycled. Consider donating them to a local charity.



Automotive parts and scrap metals

 Call your local hauler for information on local drop-off sites.



THESE ITEMS **CANNOT** BE RECYCLED

Plastic grocery bags

Recycle by taking back to the store. Look for bins designated for recycling plastic bags.



Take-out containers, pizza and donut boxes

- Recycle only #1 or #2 plastic.
- Make sure there is no food waste residue.







Styrofoam, paper cups, drink cartons

These cannot be recycled due to the plastic coating .





- Keep food and water out of recycling materials.
- Keep recyclables clean and covered.
